Eucharistic Prayer #1

- "We come to you, Father, with praise and thanksgiving, through Jesus Christ your Son" (cf. Eph. 5:20).
- "Through him we ask you to accept and bless these gifts we offer in you in sacrifice" (cf. 2 Macc. 1:26).
- "We offer them for your holy Catholic Church, watch over it, Lord, and guide it; grant it peace and unity throughout the world. We offer them for N. our pope, for N. our bishop, and for all who hold and teach the Catholic faith that comes to us from the apostles" (cf. Jn. 17:21; Acts 2:42).
- "Remember, Lord, your people, especially those for whom we now pray, N. and N. Remember all of us gathered here before you. You know how firmly we believe in you and dedicate ourselves to you. We offer you this sacrifice of praise for ourselves and those who are dear to us. We pray to you, our living and true God, for our well-being and redemption (cf. Ps. 106:4; Heb. 13:15).
- "In union with the whole Church, we honor Mary, the ever-virgin mother of Jesus Christ our Lord and God. We honor Joseph, her husband, the apostles and martyrs, Peter and Paul, Andrew...and all the saints. May their merits and prayers gain us your constant help and protection" (cf. Mt. 1:2-16; Lk. 16:9; 1 Cor. 12:12, 20f; Rev. 5:8).
- "Father, accept this offering from your whole family. Grant us your peace in this life, save us from final damnation, and count us among those you have chosen" (cf. Col. 1:11).
- "Bless and approve our offering; make it acceptable to you, an offering in spirit and in truth" (Jn. 4:24).
- "Let it become for us the body and blood of Jesus Christ, your only Son, our Lord."(cf Mark 14:22-26; Luke 22:19)
- "The day before he suffered he took bread in his sacred hands and looking up to heaven, to you, his almighty Father, he gave you thanks and praise. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you" (cf. Mt. 26:26-28).

Words of Institution

- "Take this, all of you, and eat of it, for this is my Body, which will be given up for you" (a combination of Mark 14:22; Matt 26:26; Luke 22:19; 1 Cor 11:24)
- "Take this, all of you, and drink from it, for this is the chalice of my Blood, the Blood of the new and eternal covenant, which will be poured out for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins." (a combination of Mark 14:24; Matt 26:27b-28; cf. Luke 22:17, 20; 1 Cor 11:25)
- o "Do this in remembrance of me" (only Luke 22:19; 1 Cor 11:24a, 25b)

Memorial Acclamations

- A. "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again." (cf. 1 Cor 16:22)
- B. "When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again." (cf. 1 Cor 11:26)
- C. "Save us, Savior of the world, for by your Cross and Resurrection you have set us free." (cf. Matt 8:25; Luke 4:42; Rom 8:21)

Doxology

The Lord's Prayer, Embolism, & Doxology

- The Lord's Prayer: "Our Father in heaven..." (Matt 6:9-13; cf. Luke 11:2-4; Mark 14:36; Gal 4:6)
- Embolism: "Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety as we wait in joyful hope for the coming of our Savior Jesus Christ (Jn. 17:15; Titus 2:13)

 Doxology: "For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever." (found only in some biblical manuscripts after Matt 6:13; cf. Rev 4:11; 11:15; 1 Chron 29:11)

The Greeting of Peace

Breaking of the Bread

 "Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy

on us.... Lamb of God, you take away the sins of the

world, grant us peace" (cf. Jn. 1:29, 36; Rev 5:6-13; Rev 22:1-3).

Communion Rite

- "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world.
 Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb." (John 1:29, 36; Rev 19:9)
- "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed." (Matt 8:8; cf. Luke 7:1-10)



Concluding Rite & Final Blessing

- Final Blessing (cf. Gen 28:3; Deut 14:29;

- Dismissal:
 - A. "Go forth, the Mass is ended."
 - B. "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." (cf. Mark 16:15)
 - C. "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." (cf. Ps 115:1; 1 Cor 10:31; 2 Thess 1:12)
 - D. "Go in peace." (cf. Exod 4:18; Deut 10:11-13; Judg 18:6; 1 Sam 1:17; Mark 5:34; Luke 7:50; 8:48)

Notes:

All scripture listed may not be all relatable text. If there is a "cf" in front of a verse, this means that the general idea comes from this scripture and is not a word for word recitation. "Cf" is the abbreviation for the imperative singular form of the Latin word "confer". In English, it is commonly referenced to "compare".
